Course of Fire

Stage 1 @ 100yds (12 shots).

12 scoring shots. Top 10 to count. A 'declared' fouling shot may be taken prior to commencing the COF. To be shot in ca. 1hr

Match Specific Information

1. Shooting will take place from a bench or prone and only the fore-end may be supported.
2. Any muzzle loading rifle with iron sights ONLY.
3. Target: 1 x PL-7
4. Number of Rounds Required: 12 (+1).
5. Maximum Score: 100

General Rules & Information applicable for all club championship matches

1. All entries welcome. Probationers may shoot under supervision. Cost for each competition is £5 with the exception of full bore rifle which is the £7 Blackdog fee only. No Re-entries allowed.
2. All competitions start at 10:00am unless stated otherwise
3. Competitors will be expected to assist, if required by the Range Officer, with scoring/patching etc. on the day.
4. Scoring: Inward scoring. A shot hole, the lead edge of which comes in contact with the outside of the bullseye or scoring rings of a target is given the higher value. A scoring overlay gauge will be used to determine the value of close shots. The higher value will be allowed in those cases where the flange on the gauge touches the scoring ring.
5. In case of keyhole or tipped shots the higher value is awarded if the lead edge of the bullet hole touches the scoring ring of higher value even though the hole is elongated to the bullet's length rather than being a circle of the bullet's diameter
6. Shots fired while the target is in motion will be scored as hits provided the greatest horizontal dimension of the bullet hole measures no more than one and one-half (1½) times the diameter of the bullet.
7. Visible hits and close groups. As a general rule only those hits which are visible will be scored. An exception will be made in the case where the groupings of 3 or more shots are so close that it is possible for a shot or shots to have gone through the enlarged hole without leaving a mark and there has been no evidence that a shot or shots have gone elsewhere than through the assigned target. In such a case, the shooter will be given the benefit of the doubt and scored hits for the non-visible shots, on the assumption they passed through the enlarged hole. If such assumption should place a non-visible hit in either of 2 scoring rings, it shall be scored in the higher-valued ring.
8. Your best 4 out of the 5 competitions count towards the overall Club Championship. Ten points will be awarded to the winner, nine to second, and so on down to tenth place for each of the five championship competitions.
9. In event of tied scores for major placings, decision will be on count back unless stated otherwise.
